Changing Rules of Verbs of

English Grammar

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Changing verbs from their base form (V1) to their past tense (V2) and past participle (V3) forms in English:

Rules for Regular Verbs (most common):

Add "-ed" to the base form:

V1: Walk \rightarrow V2: Walked \rightarrow V3: Walked

1. For verbs ending in "e," add only "-d" to form V2 and V3:

V1: Dance \rightarrow V2: Danced \rightarrow V3: Danced

2. For one-syllable verbs with a single vowel followed by a single consonant, double the final consonant before adding "-ed":

V1: Stop \rightarrow V2: Stopped \rightarrow V3: Stopped

3. For verbs ending in "y" after a consonant, change the "y" to "i" and add "-ed":

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V1: Study \rightarrow V2: Studied \rightarrow V3: Studied

4. For verbs ending in a vowel + "y," simply add "-ed":

V1: Play \rightarrow V2: Played \rightarrow V3: Played

- 5. Rules for Irregular Verbs (not following the regular pattern):
- 6. Verbs with the same V1, V2, and V3 forms:

V1: Put \rightarrow V2: Put \rightarrow V3: Put

7. Verbs with V1 and V2 the same, but different V3 form:

V1: Cost \rightarrow V2: Cost \rightarrow V3: Cost

8. Verbs with completely different forms for V1, V2, and V3:

V1: Go \rightarrow V2: Went \rightarrow V3: Gone

9. Verbs with vowel changes in V2 and V3:

V1: Sing \rightarrow V2: Sang \rightarrow V3: Sung

10. Verbs with "ought" in the past tense form:

V1: Buy \rightarrow V2: Bought \rightarrow V3: Bought

11. Verbs with "aught" in the past tense form:

V1: Teach \rightarrow V2: Taught \rightarrow V3: Taught

12. Verbs with "ew" or "ow" in the past tense form:

V1: Grow \rightarrow V2: Grew \rightarrow V3: Grown

13. Verbs ending in "-en" in the past participle form:

V1: Drive \rightarrow V2: Drove \rightarrow V3: Driven

13. Verbs with "ight" in the past tense form:

V1: Fight \rightarrow V2: Fought \rightarrow V3: Fought

14. Verbs with "ind" in the past tense form:

V1: Find \rightarrow V2: Found \rightarrow V3: Found

15. Verbs ending in "-ide" in the past tense form:

V1: Ride \rightarrow V2: Rode \rightarrow V3: Ridden

16. Verbs with vowel changes in V2 and V3, where V1 remains the same:

V1: Drink \rightarrow V2: Drank \rightarrow V3: Drunk

17. Verbs with "ell" or "old" in the past tense form:

V1: Tell \rightarrow V2: Told \rightarrow V3: Told

V1: Sell \rightarrow V2: Sold \rightarrow V3: Sold

18. Verbs with "ay" or "ow" in the past tense form:

V1: Say \rightarrow V2: Said \rightarrow V3: Said

V1: Grow \rightarrow V2: Grew \rightarrow V3: Grown

19. Verbs with "ought" in the past tense form, but different V1 and V3 forms:

V1: Bring \rightarrow V2: Brought \rightarrow V3: Brought

20. Verbs with "end" in the past tense form, but different V1 and V3 forms:

V1: Send \rightarrow V2: Sent \rightarrow V3: Sent

21. Verbs with "ind" in the past tense form, but different V1 and V2 forms:

V1: Find \rightarrow V2: Found \rightarrow V3: Found

22. Verbs with "ink" in the past tense form, but different V1 and V3 forms:

V1: Sink \rightarrow V2: Sank \rightarrow V3: Sunk

23. Verbs with "ite" in the past tense form, but different V1 and V3 forms:

V1: Write \rightarrow V2: Wrote \rightarrow V3: Written

24. Verbs with "end" in the past tense form, but different V2 and V3 forms:

V1: Spend \rightarrow V2: Spent \rightarrow V3: Spent



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
