

# Collective Nouns With Their Meanings

## **ANIMALS:**

- Flock - A group of birds, especially when feeding or in flight. *Example:* A flock of seagulls circled overhead.
- Herd - A group of cattle, sheep, or other animals of the same kind. *Example:* The herd of cows grazed peacefully in the pasture.
- Pod - A group of dolphins. *Example:* We spotted a pod of dolphins swimming alongside the boat.
- Pack - A group of wolves. *Example:* The alpha wolf led the pack on the hunt.

- **Pride** - A group of lions. *Example:* The pride lounged in the shade of the acacia tree.
- **Swarm** - A large group of insects, often flying together. *Example:* The swarm of bees buzzed around the hive.
- **School** - A group of fish swimming together. *Example:* We saw a school of colorful tropical fish while snorkeling.
- **Gaggle** - A group of geese on land or in water. *Example:* The gaggle of geese waddled across the field.
- **Troop** - A group of monkeys or scouts. *Example:* The troop of Boy Scouts set up their tents in the woods.
- **Colony** - A group of animals or insects living together in the same area.
- **Brood** - A group of young birds hatched at the same time. *Example:* The mother hen protected her brood of chicks.
- **Litter** - A group of baby animals born to one mother at the same time. *Example:* The litter of kittens played in the backyard.
- **Hive** - A group of bees living together. *Example:* The hive produced an abundance of honey.
- **Troop** - A group of kangaroos. *Example:* The troop of kangaroos hopped across the field.
- **Harem** - A group of female animals associated with one male. *Example:* The harem of elephants followed the dominant bull.

- Swarm - A large group of bees, wasps, or insects. Example: The swarm of wasps made us retreat quickly.
- Murder - A group of crows. Example: A murder of crows perched on the telephone wires.
- Clowder - A group of cats. Example: The clowder of cats gathered around the food dish.
- Shoal - A group of fish swimming together near the surface. Example: The shoal of fish glittered in the sunlight.
- Lounge - A group of lizards basking in the sun. Example: The lounge of iguanas sprawled on the rocks.
- Streak - A group of tigers. Example: A streak of tigers prowled through the jungle.
- Plague - A group of locusts. Example: A plague of locusts devastated the crops.
- Troop - A group of butterflies. Example: A troop of butterflies fluttered around the garden.
- Colony - A group of penguins on land. Example: The colony of penguins gathered near the shore.

- Exaltation - A group of larks. Example: An exaltation of larks filled the morning air with song.
- Bloat - A group of hippos. Example: We watched a bloat of hippos wallowing in the river.
- Pod - A group of whales or dolphins. Example: A pod of dolphins leaped gracefully through the waves.
- Lodge - A group of beavers. Example: The lodge of beavers constructed an impressive dam.
- Drove - A group of pigs or cattle being herded. Example: The drove of cattle moved slowly across the field.
- Parliament - A group of owls. Example: A parliament of owls hooted in the moonlit forest.
- Bevy - A group of quails. Example: A bevy of quails foraged for food in the grass.
- Troop - A group of kangaroos. Example: We spotted a troop of kangaroos hopping through the outback.
