The Drafting Committee had seven other prominent members who worked alongside Dr. Ambedkar:

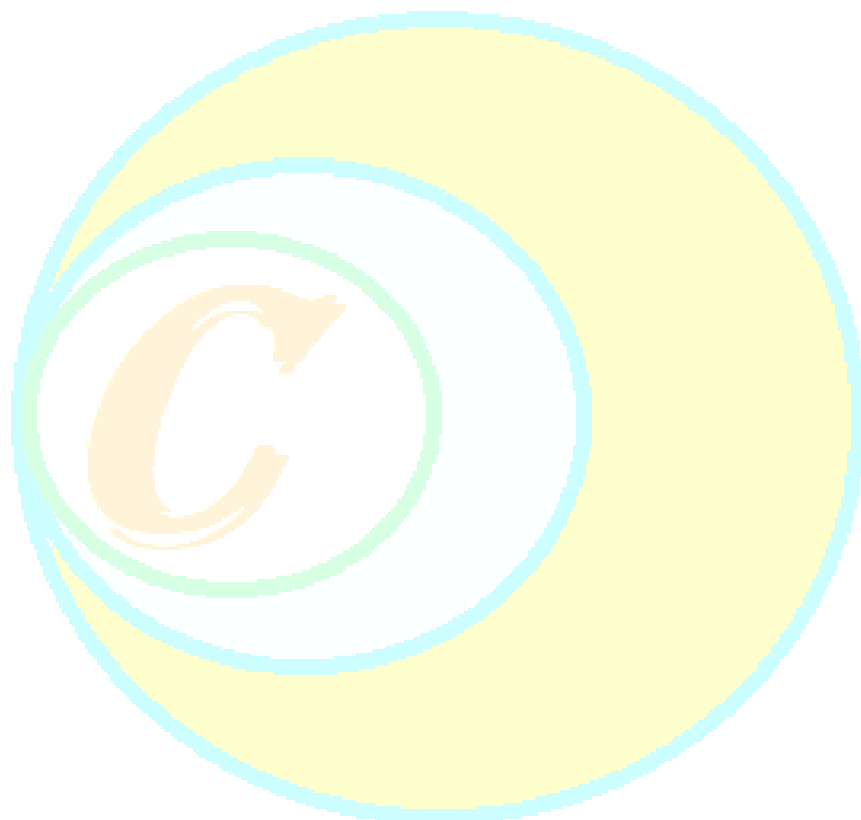
1. Alladi Krishnaswamy Ayyar: A distinguished lawyer and constitutional expert.
